A Visit to Salem Chapel

As part of the Professional Church Secretaries Conference held this week, Wesley office administrator Tom Wilkinson took part in a tour of the Salem Chapel on Geneva Street in St. Catharines. He said it "will move your spirit in ways you didn't think was possible."

The church is heavily immersed in the history of the underground railway that helped slaves find freedom by using the underground railway.

Built in 1855, Harriet Tubman attended services at Salem Chapel. She was the famous underground railroad conductor who guided dozens of slaves across the border to find freedom in Canada. Harriet Tubman lived here from 1851 to 1858. Many of those who found their freedom because of her settled in the area and attended Salem Chapel.

The church - which is still home to a small congregation – is open for tours. On the tour, you will be guided by a historian who will help you understand Tubman's history and the contributions of other black people to the church and community.

You will climb the stairs and look down from upper pews upon the church below. "It's easy to look down and feel Tubman's presence there." In the basement, you'll see walls lined with posters and photos – including a poster offering a reward for Tubman's capture.








WESLEY-ROBINS FOOD DRIVE


