A Finance Minute

What is Wesley's Endowment Fund?

In April 2005 the Endowment Fund was created through a generous donation by a member of Wesley United Church. This fund continues to grow through donations and bequests. The money in the Endowment Fund may be used for any purpose. The Endowment Fund is managed by the Trustees of Wesley United Church. The money is currently invested with the United Church of Canada Foundation (UCCF) which has over \$82,000,000 in assets and allows for much lower management fees than if congregations were to go it alone. Fiera Capital and Canoe Financial manage the UCCF money in a Balance Fund (stocks, bonds, and cash).

Income earned by Wesley's Endowment Fund normally goes to the Local Ministry Fund, usually at year end. The Endowment Fund has averaged a 9.32% annual return on investment over the last 10 years.

This year, to the end of September, the rate of return was 12.79% (\$100,574). At the end of September the value of the Endowment Fund was \$886,574.

The earnings from the Endowment Fund have supplemented regular donations and has helped Wesley keep pace with increased expenses.




In Your Wesley Library


