Food Pantry ready to go!

"I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me. " Matthew 25.

Wesley Community Food Pantry will be starting up on Monday Dec. 2.

It will be accessible Monday to Friday from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m.

What is a Food Pantry? It is a permanent red wooden box outside our church where anyone can take anything they need to help them get by. It will be filled Monday to Friday by Wesley volunteers in the morning and, in the evening, everything that is not taken that day will be brought in.

It will be stocked with canned food and store bought non-perishable packaged food items only.

There will be a sign on the box saying:

Wesley Community Food Pantry Accessible Monday to Friday from 9 a.m. - 5

You are welcome to take whatever you need but perhaps leave some so that others can enjoy too. There will be a basket in our front hallway for anyone to donate food items at any time. We hope all who come through our doors will be willing to help by caring for those less fortunate.

We will be delivering flyers to our neighbours to let them know the "Wesley Community Food Box" is up and running and they are welcome to donate canned goods or to let others in need know that it is there for them. Thanks goes to Glen Moore for building the box and to Del and his team of Mike Carreau and Don Shabot for setting it in place. Wonderful job gentlemen. Thank you everyone for helping care for

those less fortunate.

A Finance Minute

What is Wesley's HARVEST KITCHEN FUND?

Since the late 1990s, Wesley has participated in the Out-of-the-Cold program which is now called Harvest Kitchen. Volunteers from Wesley cook for about 100 people on the first Sunday of the month from November to March each year. The food is purchased by money donated to this fund. The money for this und resides in the CIBC Checking Account.

Due to Covid-19, our participation with Harvest Kitchen was placed on hold in 2020, but as of November 3, 2024 Wesley is once again participating in the Harvest Kitchen program at Central United.

In 2024 the fund started with a balance of \$46. As of Nov.10, we received \$510 in donations and had expenses of \$332 leaving a balance of \$223.


