What is Wesley's MEMORIAL FUND?



Donations in memory of a loved one are managed by the Memorial Committee. Money contributions to the Memorial Fund are restricted in their use and may not be used to meet the operating costs of the congregation. However, they may be used for the protection and preservation of memorial gifts. Funds contributed to the Memorial Fund and designated as Memorial Fund "Local" may be used to meet the operating costs of the congregation. Any Memorial Fund surplus money is transferred to a Tangerine Bank account to earn interest.


