The new ceremony will be called Music & Light and will be held Sunday, Feb. 9 during our regular service of worship. (Please note: this is not a fundraising event.)

W&M focus is on music

Wesley's Worship and Music committee met on Jan. 9 and discussed a number of issues. An important topic of conversation was two letters received from members of the congregation, both of which suggested the Christmas Eve service could have been improved upon. The writers cited a couple of issues and both members wished it had offered more for a family. Another was concerned that a lot of money had been spent on music in recent weeks.

As far as the suggestion for a more family-oriented service, the consensus of the committee was that we agreed with this and will strive to make that happen next year. Any suggestions would be gratefully considered.

In regards to the funds spent on music, Worship and Music has stayed within its music budget in 2024 and had planned to bring in more music during the Christmas season. It is our belief that music will bring more people to Wesley. In 2025, the focus will be to bring more vocalists to Wesley.

New this year is the Music and Light Celebration, which will be held Feb. 9. This will take the former Memorial Hymn Sing and combine it with a service to honour the friends and family of our Wesley family who passed away in 2024. Members of the congregation are asked to dedicate hymns to loved ones – past and present – for the music portion of the service. (Unlike previous Memorial Hymn Sings, this is not a fund-raising event and we will not be asking for donations.) We will also take time during the service to light a candle in memory of those who passed in 2024. Family or friends of those we lost will be invited to come to the front to light the candle. If there is someone you would like honoured at the candlelighting (and they don't need to have been a member of Wesley – just someone who was loved and remembered by one of our congregation), please let our office administrator Tom know.

The committee also discussed a proposal by Music Director George Cleland to have an evening of music and narration that would depict the seven utterances of Christ on the cross. The committee was in favour of this event, which should happen at Easter time and we hope to draw in a wider audience and raise funds through a goodwill offering.

Plans are underway to have some sort of celebration of Wesley's 70th anniversary – perhaps a dinner - although more time and effort will be spent on the 75th.

Plans are also shaping up to bring back Holy Humour Sunday. This would take place on the Sunday after Easter.


Worship and Music is always interested in feedback from the congregation. We are grateful that people take the time to write the committee.
