## Highlights from the January/February 2025 edition of Broadview

#### **UNDER ONE ROOF**

Multi-Generational Households are the fastest-growing type of family household in Canada. According to Statistics Canada, as of 2021, 2.4 million Canadians - that's 6.4 per cent of the total population - live in multigenerational households. That's a 50-per-cent increase since 2001. There are benefits to this type of housing - but there's also challenges.

#### **COOKING WITH SPIRIT**

In Jody Eddy's cookbook *Elysian Kitchens: Recipes Inspired by the Traditions and Tastes of the World's Sacred Spaces*, readers are introduced to monks, priests, rabbis, nuns and pirs (Sufi spiritual leaders) as she seeks out "the universal truth of food." The article even includes a recipe for Cheesy Biscuits which are baked at least once a week by the monks at Saint John's in Minnesota.

#### LIVING IN LIMBO

Crossroads United Church in Kingston stepped up to offer space when a cabin community for the homeless had to move. Despite their best efforts, the project fell through. But Church Council member Allan Baer, who was the church liaison person for the project, believes the congregation's work could serve as a guide for other communities of faith.

# A Message From the Treasurer

The Department of Finance and the Canada Revenue Agency confirmed that the federal government's announcement made last month to extend the 2024 charitable tax deadline to Feb. 28, 2025 would be applied.

This extension aims to mitigate the impacts of last year's four-week Canada Post mail delivery stoppage and its negative effects on charities during the critical holiday season when mail-in donations play a crucial role.

Key points of the now-official extension include:

- 1. The extended deadline applies to donations made up to Feb. 28, 2025, for the 2024 tax year.
- 2. It covers "cash" donations or those transferred by cheque, credit card, money order, or electronic payment.
- 3. The extension does not apply to gifts in kind, payroll deductions, or bequests from individuals who die after 2024

Note: You have a choice to apply your January & February, 2025 donations to either the taxation year 2024 or 2025, you cannot use the donation deduction twice.

Income tax receipts for January and February, 2025 donations to be applied to your 2024 taxation year, will only be issued by request. Contact the envelope steward (Wendy Reed) at 905-735-7876 or by e-mail davewendy114@yahoo.ca, if you want an income tax receipt.

Income tax receipts for the 2024 calendar year will be issued to all donors as normal, before the end of February, 2025.
